

LED Indicators for Operational and Charging Status

| LED Indication | Operational Status | Charging Status |
|--------------------------|---|------------------------------------|
| Solid green | Is transmitting; Radio is powering on | Fully charged |
| Blinking green | Incoming call; During call hang-time | Not applicable |
| Blinking green slowly | In Area Talkgroup | Not applicable |
| Solid red | Not applicable | Rapid charge |
| Blinking red | Out of Service, Charging failure, Faulty battery | Charging failure Faulty battery |
| Blinking red slowly | Radio out of range | Not applicable |
| Blinking green and amber | In Do Not Disturb Mode | Not applicable |
| Solid amber | Emergency mode | Not applicable |
| Blinking amber | Incoming IPA Incoming Emergency Alert | Not applicable |

Battery Capacity Information

| Icon | LED Indication | Voice Announcement | Description |
|------|---------------------------------|-----------------------|-----------------------|
| | Solid green | Battery high | 80%–100% capacity |
| • | Solid amber | Battery medium | 60%-80% capacity |
| • | Solid amber | Battery medium | 25%-60% capacity |

Inserting the SIM Card





- 1. Lift up the SIM card slot cover.
- 2. With the contacts facing down, align the card notched end first and slide the SIM card into the slot.

Note: Depending on your radio model, if your radio has the SIM card slot, you can insert the SIM card as instructed. At any time, peeling off the radio label voids the warranty.

Attaching the Battery



1. Align the battery contacts with the contacts inside the battery compartment. Insert the contact side of the battery. Push the battery in

2. Insert the bottom tabs of the battery cover into the slot. Press down the top part followed by the middle part of the battery cover.



3. Slide the latch into lock position.

Attaching and Removing the Antenna



- 1. Turn the radio off.
- 2. Align the bottom part of the antenna to the threaded base on top of the radio.
- 3. a. To attach the antenna, turn clockwise until snug. Do not force.
- b. To remove the antenna, turn counterclockwise.

Looking After The Radio

Never leave the radio or battery in extreme temperatures (over +60 °C/140 °F), for example, behind a windscreen in direct sunlight.

The radio is **not** submersible. To clean the radio, use a moistened or antistatic cloth.

Activating and Provisioning the Radio

Before using the radio, make sure the WAVE Customer account is activated

To activate the WAVE Customer account, scan the QR code on the label behind the battery or visit the following website: https://waveoncloud.com/activate

After the device is activated, provisioning of radio features and programmable button can be configured in the WAVE portal.

Turning the Radio On/Off

To turn the radio on, press and hold the **On/Off/Info** Button until the LED status indicator lights up.

To turn the radio off, press and hold the **On/Off/Info** Button until the screen displays powering off animation.

Using the Menu/Programmable Button

You can program the programmable buttons as shortcuts to radio functions in the WAVE portal.

For the default radio setting, press is assigned to the Menu and press and hold is assigned to the Contact List.

Using the Radio Menu

To enter and scroll through the menu, press the Menu/Programmable

To scroll through the programmed function in the sub-menu, press the Volume Button

To exit the menu, press the On/Off/Info Button, Talkgroup/Contact List Scroll Rocker, PTT Button, or wait for timer to expire.

On/Off/Info Button

Press the On/Off/Info Button. The radio sounds and displays the emergency and alert list, Instant Personal Alert (IPA) list, battery strength level, cellular strength level. Wi-Fi strength level, software available for installation indicator (restart to install), and radio name. When the radio displays the battery strength level, the battery strength LED status indicator lights up.

Talkgroup List and Contact List

To select Group List, toggle the Talkgroup/Contact List Scroll Rocker. If Contact List is pre-programmed to your radio, short or long press the Menu/Programmable Button directly to access the Contact List, else manually enter the Contact List with the menu function. To scroll through the Contact List, toggle the Talkgroup/Contact List Scroll Rocker or push the Volume Button. To exit, press the Menu/Programmable Button.

Making Group Calls

The radio must be configured as part of that group to make a call to a group of users. Select a channel with the active group alias or ID. Press the PTT Button. The LED status indicator lights up solid green. The display shows the group call alias. Wait for the Talk Permit Tone to finish (if enabled), speak into the microphone. Release the PTT Button to listen.

Making Private Calls

If Contact List is pre-programmed to your radio, short or long press the Menu/Programmable Button directly to access the Contact List, else manually enter the Contact List with the menu function. Select the preconfigured contact. Press the PTT Button. Once the call is connected. the LED status indicator lights up solid green and displays the subscriber alias. Wait for the Talk Permit Tone to finish (if enabled), speak into the microphone. Release the PTT Button to listen.
